EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS



Emergencies can happen anytime!

- They can strike anyone
- They don't just happen to other people

Being prepared is important

- It can save your life
- It can help you take care of yourself

How prepared are you? Did you.....

- Find and fix hazards
- Plan how to stay informed
- Get emergency supplies
- Plan ways to get help
- Get a medical bracelet
- Be ready to evacuate
- Know how to turn off your house water, gas and electricity
- Let neighbors know you may need help during an emergency

Fire safety is a must!

- Install and test smoke detectors
- Sleep on the first floor, if possible
- Plan your escape
- Try to get out right away
- Keep doors closed if you can't get out
- Stop, drop and roll if your clothing catch on fire
- Turn off any oxygen equipment immediately
- Ask your fire department about fire sprinkler systems. Also ask how to protect against carbon monoxide (CO)

Stay safe in a storm

Listen for local alerts and instructions for:

- Thunderstorms
- Tornados
- Floods
- Hurricanes
- Winter Storms



Heat waves and cold snaps can be deadly

Ask family and friends to check on you often.

In hot weather:

- Stay cool
- Watch for heat exhaustion
- Get immediate medical help for heat stroke:
 - Dial 911 or your local number for emergency medical services. Delay can be deadly!

In cold weather:

- Stay warm
- Watch for drop in body temperature:
 - Temperature below 95 degree is dangerous. Delay can be deadly
- Re-warm the body

During an earthquake,

If you're inside:

 Stay inside, find cover: somesturdy with arms covering head



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If you're outside:

Stay outside and move into the open area
