Your nurse tried to explain to her that the bed had to have the gel mattress to prevent her skin from breaking down. She was lovely and spent a good deal of time assessing Pat's condition and needs. Then Yvonne came. What a gem! I left Wednesday night and went straight to Holly Manor. Her nurse gave me a whole bag of diapers. In the morning I spoke with the director of p/t to ask about ordering a different wheelchair. She said she would order one through Tricare but as far as the bed goes, that is what she needs, a special gel foam covering to protector skin. She also told me in no uncertain terms that Pat would simply "have to get used to it" and to stop trying to make everything perfect for her.

Thursday morning, I left Holly Manor and went straight to Pat's. I found her standing at the sink in her bathroom brushing her teeth with Yvonne right beside her. There was a commode over the toilet and Yvonne said she was able to use it. In less than 24 hours she had Pat doing things she had refused to even try. Not to mention Pat looked great.

Everyday since has been better than the one before. Yesterday was Pat's birthday. We all staggered our visits so it wouldn't overwhelm her. Mia, Yvonne had her dressed in her own clothes, jewelry, hair done and make-up! She looked the best she's looked in I don't know how long. You could tell she felt good about herself. Each and every visitor/family member couldn't get over Yvonne and the beautiful way she has with Pat. Yvonne not only cares for her but encourages her to do more. It is an amazing thing to see.

I'm sorry to be so long winded about this but I'm sure you must know how wonderful Yvonne is and from the bottom of my heart, I thank you for choosing her for Pat.

Independence Day Interesting facts

Families often celebrate Independence Day by hosting or attending a picnic or barbecue; many take advantages of the day off and, in some years, a long weekend to gather with relatives or friends. Decorations (e.g., streamers, balloons, and clothing) are generally colored red, white, and blue, the colors of the American flag. Parades are often held in the morning, before family get-togethers, while fireworks display occur in the evening after dark at such places as parks, fairgrounds, or town squares.



Independence Day fireworks are often accompanied by patriotic songs such as the national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner"; "God Bless America"; "America the Beautiful"; "My Country, 'Tis of Thee"; "This Land Is Your Land"; "Stars and Stripes Forever"; and, regionally, "Yankee Doodle" in northeastern states and "Dixie" in southern states. Some of the lyrics recall images of the Revolutionary War or the War of 1812.

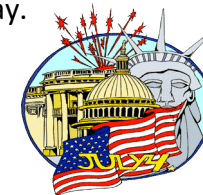


New York City has the largest fireworks display in the country, with more than 22 tons of pyrotechnics exploded in 2009. It generally holds displays in the East River. Other major displays are

in Seattle on Lake Union; in San Diego over Mission Bay; in Boston on the Charles River; in Philadelphia over the Philadelphia Museum of Art; in San Francisco over the San Francisco Bay; and on the National Mall in Washington, D.C.



Coincidentally, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, the only signers of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as Presidents of the United States, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signer of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as President, also died on July 4, 1831. He was the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. Calvin Coolidge, the 30th President, was born on July 4, 1872; so far he is the only U.S. President to have been born on Independence Day.



The first week of July is typically one of the busiest United States travel periods of the year, as many people use what is often a three-day holiday weekend for extended vacation trips.
